

NEDERLAND SNOWSHOE TOUR

Friday, April 26 8:00 a.m. - 4:30 p.m. Nederland, CO

Strap on your snowshoes and get ready for a winter adventure! Discover a recently completed project in Nederland – a public access open space owned by Boulder County. We'll have an opportunity to explore alongside our county partners to learn about the values of the property.

Then warm up with a delicious lunch in the historic mountain town of Nederland while reviewing the morning's tour.

EASTERN PLAINS TOUR

Thursday, May 2 9:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m. Strasburg, CO

Journey to the eastern plains of Colorado. This landscape is significant because 48% of native grasslands have been lost in Colorado, yet support more than twice as many species of concern than any other habitat. Our tour will investigate the increasing development pressures of the region and our work protecting both the prairie grasslands and ranching heritage this region is known for.


* Due to landowner scheduling flexibility, this event will take place either on May 10 or 31. Once the date is finalized, it will be communicated.



SOUTH PARK TOUR

Friday, June 21 8:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m. South Park, CO

Get ready for a day of breathtaking views and resilient landscapes. We start the day with a hike on the Colorado Trail to an incredible overlook of the entire South Park Valley, where our CEO & President, Tony Caligiuri, will share the region's uniquely Coloradan history and community. After a picnic lunch, get your feet wet as we traverse through densely restored riverscapes with Dirk Rasmussen, COL's Restoration Program Manager. We'll learn about how these efforts resonate with COL's mission and why they are critical for people living on the Front Range.



GUNNISON OVERNIGHT

Friday, July 19 - Saturday, July 20 7:30 a.m. - 6:30 p.m. Gunnison, CO

Uncover the values of another one of Colorado Open Lands' priority landscapes, the Gunnison Basin, on this overnight excursion in the middle of peak wildflower season. Learn how conservation has shaped this landscape as you hike on the Mill-Castle Trail and meet the community catalysts who are key to the conservation of this region. On the second day we will visit the reclaimed ghost town of Gothic, which is now home to the Rocky Mountain Biological Laboratory and their groundbreaking climate change research. Throughout the trip, you will also have the opportunity to explore Gunnison with your COL and CLS friends.

* We ask each participant to contribute \$150 for hotel accommodation. The remaining cost will be paid by COL. Scholarships may be available.
